1. Call to Order

President Winsome Rauch called the meeting to order at **7:00 PM**. Quorum was confirmed.

2. Welcome & Introductions

Acknowledgement of the local Indigenous communities, including the **Stó:lō, Sumas First Nation, and Matsqui First Nation**. Expectations for respectful dialogue were reviewed.

3. Trades & Career Programs Presentation

Michael Pearson – Career Programs Overview

Michael Pearson provided an overview of district career and trades programs, noting approximately 20 program options available to students, with applications generally beginning in Grade 10. He highlighted dual credit opportunities, application requirements, and the importance of meeting prerequisites. Updates included new partnerships and recent changes to programs such as the Abbotsford Police Academy. Pearson explained application processes, priority for district students, and varying program demand. Trades programs were noted as providing strong pathways to both post-secondary education and employment.

Questions & Discussion

Questions addressed program access for French Immersion students, private-to-public school transfers, cybersecurity intake timelines, and promotion of under-subscribed programs. Pearson encouraged families to follow up with school facilitators and attend orientations when applicable.

4. Board Governance & Student Success

Stan Peterson – Board Chair

Stan Peterson outlined the Board's governance role, including policy development, budget oversight, hiring of the superintendent, and strategic planning. He highlighted the district's strong trades programming and shared concerns regarding literacy and numeracy outcomes at the elementary level. Peterson confirmed that parents are welcome to submit written and verbal questions at board meetings and emphasized the importance of parent and community involvement.

5. District Conflict Resolution Process

Nathan Ngieng – Superintendent

Superintendent Nathan Ngieng reviewed the district's conflict resolution process, emphasizing respectful communication and addressing concerns at the school level first. He outlined escalation steps involving assistant superintendents and the deputy superintendent and referenced Policy 14 for rare appeals to the Board. He reaffirmed the district's commitment to transparency, positive relationships, and student success. Superintendent Ngieng agreed to improve clarity on district roles and responsibilities on the district website.

6. President's Report

DPAC members participated in district and provincial engagement opportunities, including the District Planning Team Meeting and the BCCPAC Advocacy Workshop. Outreach to PACs continued, with support provided for BCCPAC membership renewals—resulting in 40 of 46 Abbotsford schools holding active memberships by the end of December. DPAC also delivered PAC training through PAC 101 and responded to ongoing PAC inquiries related to grants, volunteers, safety, and school concerns.

Advocacy efforts included communication with BC Ministers regarding the proposed safe consumption site near ATS. DPAC representatives attended district-led parent engagement events focused on mental health and community supports.
