1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. Quorum was established and introductions were made.

3.1 President's Annual Report

The President provided an overview of the year's activities and accomplishments.

Provincial Representation

- DPAC representatives attended the BCCPAC Conference. Keynote speaker Hannah Beach addressed youth mental health, anxiety, resilience, the importance of free play, reduced screen dependence, and stronger community connections.
- Abbotsford DPAC was represented at the BCCPAC AGM by 25 voting members (21 proxy schools and 4 delegate schools), representing approximately 16% of voting members present.
- A parent resolutions survey was distributed prior to the AGM to guide voting in alignment with parent priorities.

Parent Learning and Events

- Funding was directed toward parent priorities including mental health and emotional well-being, bullying support, and study skills.
- Additional sessions were offered on vaping, district trades programs, and post-secondary planning.
- Other events included a trustee by-election all-candidates meeting, PAC 101 sessions, and a PAC networking evening.

Additional Work Completed

- Launch of the DPAC website and monthly newsletter.
- Improved communication systems and establishment of a PAC networking WhatsApp group.
- Ongoing support to PACs and families through email and Zoom meetings.
- Assistance with BCCPAC membership renewals for 37 PACs.
- Representation at provincial BCCPAC meetings.

Looking Ahead

- Updating the website and newsletter systems.
- Strengthening PAC networking opportunities.
- Exploring literacy and numeracy parent education events.
- Continuing to respond to parent feedback regarding programming.

The President thanked the Executive team and DPAC members for their contributions throughout the year.
